ORDINANCE 19 – SECTION 19.09

AN ORDINANCE CREATING SECTION 19.09
OF THE GENERAL CODE OF ORDINANCES

The Town Board of the Town of Dunn, Dane County, Wisconsin does ordain that Chapter 19 Section 19.09 of the General Code of Ordinances, entitled Road Side Parking be and the same is hereby created to read as follows:

Section 19.09 Road Side Parking

- (1) **General:** Vehicles and/or trailers parked on the side of any road shall not: interfere with traffic; obstruct the line of sight of persons traveling in vehicles on that road; and/or otherwise create a public safety hazard.
- (2) **Paved Roads:** Vehicles and/or trailers parked on the side of any paved road must park completely off the paved portion of the road.
- (3) **Unpaved Roads:** Vehicles and/or trailers parked on the side of any unpaved road must park in a manner so as not to obstruct the flow of two-way traffic on that road.
- (4) **Vehicles for Sale:** No person may park any vehicle for the purposes of displaying such vehicle for sale on any highway or right of way of any highway.
